About Mosaic Post-production Lab

Mosaic Post-production Lab, an initiative of The Royal Film Commission - Jordan (RFC), is a pioneering regional training program designed to support Arab film editors and directors in the post-production stage of their first or second feature-length films. This consultancy program aims to elevate filmmakers' creative potential, enabling them to deliver the best version of their envisioned films with guidance from highly qualified experts.

Program Overview

Phase 1: Online Consultancy (Three Months from 4th November 2024 to 9th February 2025)

The first phase offers a comprehensive online consultancy with a diverse group of industry experts. This phase focuses on the creative aspects of post-production, helping filmmakers craft coherent and compelling stories through effective editing. Participants will learn best practices for workflows that minimize disruptions to their creative process and receive valuable tips on editing video and sound tailored to their film's genre, mood, and tone.

- Personalized consultations with industry experts
- Best practices for efficient workflows
- Creative techniques for video and sound editing

Phase 2: In-person Lab (Five Days in Jordan from 10th – 16th April 2025)

The second phase involves an intensive five-day lab in Jordan, featuring private screenings to target groups followed by insightful Q&A sessions. These sessions provide filmmakers with critical feedback for refining their

cuts. Additionally, participants will engage in group sessions and one-on-one meetings with industry experts covering essential topics such as color grading, sound design, and VFX.

- Advanced training in color grading, sound design, and VFX

Participating in the Mosaic Post-production Lab will empower filmmakers with the knowledge, skills, and expertise to creatively tell their stories and elevate their films to compete internationally. The Arab Producers Lab (APL) is an immersive program aimed at Arab producers and directors working on their first or second narrative feature films, the program is in collaboration with the European Audiovisual Entrepreneurs (EAVE), Europe's leading training, development, and networking organization for producers.

The Lab focuses on strengthening the skills of producers by enabling them to understand and contribute to the entire creative production process. During the lab's five intensive days, the producers and directors will experience training sessions through the film they are working on. The sessions will include one-on-one and group sessions with internationally acclaimed producing experts focusing on packaging, financing, co-production, international markets and sales, as well as more specific territories like the MENA and EU.

Each round will include 6 to 8 participating producers and writer/director teams with feature narrative projects aiming to equip Arab producers with the necessary skills to engage in the creative production process actively, prioritizing talent identification, script development, and project advancement. The Lab provides comprehensive insights into MENA, European, and global markets, aiding producers in audience identification, product packaging, partnership building, and securing production and distribution financing.

Additionally, it offers insight into financial and corporate development, underlining the importance of long-term viability for competitiveness. The Lab fosters cooperation, co-financing, and co-production among Arab producers as crucial strategies for success in a competitive landscape. It also creates opportunities for Arab producers to collaborate with industry leaders, expanding networks, improving quality, and increasing production feasibility. Furthermore, The Lab enhances understanding of rapid changes in media industries, including shifts in distribution, exhibition, and emerging market opportunities such as video on demand (VOD) and digital distribution.

Ultimately, the Lab aims to empower Arab producers to establish unique industry voices and contribute to its evolution.

Mosalsalat Screenwriters Lab was held for the first time in 2019, and it is organized by the Royal Film Commission – Jordan.

Mosalsalat Screenwriters Lab is an annual five-day series script development lab aimed at independent Arab screenwriters working on their first or second narrative series projects.

Selecting projects and participants for the Lab is done by a selection committee (Creative Consultants) of film and TV professionals who work with the Mosalsalat Screenwriters Lab team throughout the selection process.

Screenwriters joining the Lab will experience one-on-one mentoring sessions with international accomplished screenwriters (Creative Advisors). The goal of the program is to guide and strengthen the writers' understanding

of story concept, structure, and character development with the intention of producing a pilot script and supporting materials.

About Rawi

Rawi Screenwriters Lab is an annual five-day screenplay development workshop aimed at independent Arab screenwriters working on their first or second narrative feature screenplays. Screenwriters joining the lab will be experiencing one-on-one mentoring sessions with internationally acclaimed screenwriters Creative Advisors from all over the world. The emphasis of the lab is to develop the writer's individual voice as a storyteller. Advisors and fellows will engage in an in-depth dialogue about the craft of screenwriting and rewriting process, as well as the fellows' individual visions for their stories.

Each year, fellows and advisors work intensively for five days on their feature narrative screenplays. Each fellow will have several one-on-one story sessions with the lab's creative advisors. The advisors' guidance ranges from improving the fellow's technique as a screenwriter, to life lessons and practical suggestions to be explored in their next draft. Emphasis is placed on each fellow's individual voice and story.

An advisory committee of writers, established film critics, screenplay editors, script doctors, scholars and film professionals work with the Lab team throughout the selection process. They are referred to as Creative Consultants. The primary short listing is based on script merits: story, originality, characters, dialogue, structure, writing style, individual voices, the status of the screenplay and its suitability to benefit from the Lab. Where applicable, we look very closely at the directing work of the writer.

Over the past 18 years, the lab has supported under the mentorship of around 100 advisors more than 143 emerging screenwriters and counting, from different Arab countries including: Jordan, Tunisia, Lebanon, Egypt, Morocco, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Palestine, Syria, Kuwait, Algeria, Iran, Yeman, Sudan, Bahrain and the UAE.
